

Jesse Griner

Dies in Hospital

Jesse Griner, 68, 1012 S. Leeds St., died at 3:30 p.m. Wednesday in St. Joseph's Memorial Hospital shortly after being admitted. He had been in failing health, but death was unexpected.

Born Dec. 31, 1896 at Milton, Ind., Mr. Griner was the son of Robert and Alice (Cornthwaite) Griner, and had lived in Kokomo since 1911. He was married in 1920 to Pauline Wainwright, and she survives.

Mr. Griner was employed in the machine shop of Continental Steel Corp. the last 15 years. He had also been employed by General Electric Co., and for 22 years was a meter reader for the gas company.

He attended Forest Lawn Nazarene Church, and was a member of USW Local No. 1954.

Survivors in addition to the widow are two sons, David Griner of Kokomo and Sgt. Zane Griner, stationed with the US Air Force at Hanscom AFB, Mass.; three grandsons; four granddaughters; and one uncle. One son preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be at 3:30 p.m. Saturday in the Ellers Chapel with the Rev. Oscar Sheets in charge. Burial will be in Albright Cemetery.
