Catherine Ingels Brokaw Lamb, 90, formerly of Indianapolis, died 12:50 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 10, 2005, at Northwoods Village in Kokomo. She was born Oct. 27, 1914, on a farm near Greentown, a daughter of Fred and Daisy (Hunt) Ingels. On Dec. 18, 1964, at Grace United Methodist Church in Kokomo, she married Don Lamb and he died May 26, 2001.

She graduated from New Harmony High School and Indiana University. She served with the U.S. Navy during World War II as an aviation machinist mate second class.

She taught school in Kokomo at Roosevelt and Lafayette Park schools and in Indianapolis at Washington High School. She moved back to Kokomo in 1999.

She was a former member of Grace United Methodist Church and a member of Broad Ripple United Methodist Church.
