

Claude Reynolds Dies Sunday In Kentucky

Claude F. (Curley) Reynolds, 49, Hemlock, special Howard County deputy sheriff, died in the General Hospital in Louisville, Ky., at 8 p.m. Sunday. He became ill suddenly while on a trip south.

Born in Charleston, Ill., Dec 7, 1914, he was the son of Frank and Vianna Kathryn (Stanford) Reynolds. He had been a resident of Kokomo and Howard County most of his life.

He was an employe of Swartwout Fabricators Inc.

A veteran of World War II was a member of the Hemlock Baptist Church and had been a former member of the board of trustees at the church.

He was married to Miss Violet Richie, Oct. 7, 1939, and she survives.

Surviving with the widow are two daughters, Mrs. William (Jolene) Moore, Oakford, and Miss Rena Reynolds, at home; one son, Charles of LaPorte; five grandchildren; three brothers, Jesse, Edgar and Bert, all of Kokomo; two sisters, Mrs. Fred (Gladys) Ritchie, Center, and Mrs. Coyd (Juanita) Harness, Kokomo R.R. 6.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Hemlock Baptist Church with the Rev. Chester Mitchell officiating. Burial in Albright Cemetery.

Friends may call at Ellers Funeral Chapel after noon Tuesday until noon Wednesday. The body will lie in state at the church for one hour preceding the services.
