

Henry N. Steele

Funeral services for Henry N. Steele, 1416 N. Lindsay St., who died Friday afternoon in St. Joseph's Memorial Hospital, will be at 2 p.m. Monday in the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter-Day Saints, Center Road. Elder Paul Sutterfield will be in charge, and burial will be in Albright Cemetery. The Veterans of Foreign Wars will conduct graveside services.

Mr. Steele was born Aug. 9, 1884, at Oriskany, N. Y., the son of Henry N. and Della (Quick) Steele.

Before entering military service in World War I, he was employed as a foreman in the Whitesboro Cloth Mills, Whitesboro, N.Y. While serving during the war, he received a permanent disability.

Mr. Steele was a member of Disabled American Veterans, Batesville, Ind. chapter. He was an elder in the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter-Day Saints.

Surviving are the widow, the former Julia Cook, whom he married July 16, 1927; two daughters, Mrs. Bonnie D. Stults, Edinburg, Ind., and Mrs. John A. (Jessie) Biehle, Kokomo; two sisters, Mrs. Joseph (Mabel) Nyboer, Rochester, Minn., and Mrs. Sadie Corts, Fort Wayne; 10 grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.
