

# WM. H. HARRISON DIES

KDT 28-4-1928

HAD LIVED ALL HIS 82 YEARS  
IN HOWARD COUNTY—A  
PIONEER HACKMAN.

William Henry Harrison, aged 82, a pioneer resident of the county, passed away at his home, 116 West State street, suddenly, of heart trouble, Saturday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock. He was sitting on his porch when stricken, dying an hour later. Mr. Harrison has been in ill health for more than a year but had been feeling better of late.

The funeral will be held at the New London Friends church Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock. At 1 o'clock a G. A. R. service will be conducted at the home.

Mr. Harrison drove a mail and passenger coach for many years, between Kokomo and Shanghai, and became widely known in the county. For a number of years he operated meat shops in Greentown, New London, West Middleton, and other small towns. He moved from West Middleton to his West State street home in 1918 and had resided there since.

Mr. Harrison was a native of Howard county, being born near Vermont, February 19, 1846, and was a son of Eli and Rachel Harrison. He was reared in this county to manhood and spent the later years of his life within its confines, mostly in the New London and West Middleton neighborhoods.

He served in the Civil war and was a member of the 153rd regiment of the Indiana Volunteer Infantry, serving until a year after the war when he was honorably discharged with the rank of corporal. He was a comrade and fellow soldier of...
