

ELIZABETH HAWORTH DEAD

Pioneer Succumbs at Her Home Near
New London.

Elizabeth P. Haworth, aged eighty, died Saturday at the home of her son Frank, near New London. Death came after an illness of more than a year's duration.

The funeral was held from the New London Friends' church at 2 o'clock this afternoon, conducted by the Rev. L. W. McFarland. Burial was in the New London cemetery.

Mrs. Haworth was the daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth Terrell. She was born in Highland county, O., Sept. 18, 1831, and became the wife of Morris Haworth December 6, 1849. Mr. Haworth died in 1903.

The couple came to Howard county in 1852, and lived here since that time. Mrs. Haworth was an aunt of Prof. C. V. Haworth, principal of the Kokomo high school.

Mrs. Haworth was of the best type of pioneers—a simple, quiet, gentle, earnest and God-fearing woman, helpful in need and patient in trouble, and a lifelong worker in the cause for good. She will be missed.
