

# DIES AT RUSSIAVILLE

MRS. LUELLA JACKSON VICTIM  
OF THREE-DAY ILLNESS AT  
HER HOME THERE.

Mrs. Luella Chadwell Jackson, widow of the late Amos Jackson, died at her home at Russiaville early Wednesday morning, following a sudden illness of only three days. She had been a resident of Howard county for more than half a century.

Born in Ripley county, Ind., on Feb. 22, 1862, she later came to Howard county with her family and was united in marriage with Mr. Jackson, who died in 1906. Seven children were born to them, three of whom are living: Mrs. Ervin Middleton, 1808 South Main street, Kokomo; Harry Jackson, 1816 South Main street, and Clem Jackson of Pontiac, Mich. Several grandchildren also survive her. Mrs. Jackson was a member of the Russiaville Friends church.

The funeral will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Russiaville Friends church. Friends may call at the residence after Thursday morning, and the casket will not be opened at the church. Burial will be in the New London cemetery.
