

Pete' Baldwin Dies After Long Illness

Lawrence "Pete" Baldwin died at 5:30 o'clock Friday evening at his home, 1814 North Indiana avenue, following a long period of ill health. His illness became acute four months ago, at which time he went to the Veterans hospital in Indianapolis and later to the hospital at Dayton, Ohio. He came home from Dayton only Wednesday.

Mr. Baldwin's life had been spent in Kokomo and vicinity and he was known in a wide circle, particularly among those connected with the manufacture of pottery here. He had been employed at the Kokomo Sanitary Pottery until illness compelled his retirement.

He saw service in the World War I, going to France with the 38th Division, serving with a headquarters battery. He was a member of the James D. Gilliday post of the American Legion.

He is survived by his wife, Jean and two sons, Harold and George. He leaves also four sisters, Mrs. George Campbell of Indianapolis, Mrs. Will Gordon and Mrs. Aggie Prather of Kokomo and Mrs. Chris Fisher of Andria and one brother, Charles Baldwin of Kokomo. A sister, Mrs. Elmer Ridgeway and a brother Orville preceded him in death.
