

HARLEY C. LONG

Harley C. Long, 70, farmer and life long resident of Ervin township, died at 9:30 o'clock Tuesday morning at his home, one-half mile west of the Judson church. He suffered a paralytic stroke Sunday morning.

He was born December 28, 1878 in Ervin township, the son of Abraham and Sarah Long, one of a family of 13 children of whom six survive. On January 17, 1904 he was married to Lottie B. Lee who survives with seven children. They are: Kenneth and Verlin Long who are engaged in farming near the parental home, Earl, Arnold, Wilma, Verma and Dean who live at home. There are five grandchildren.

The surviving brothers and sisters are: Dr. John Long of Philadelphia, Henry of Richmond, Ind., Ed of West Middleton, Mrs. Elizabeth Porter of Burlington, Lincoln and Tom of Kokomo. Mrs. Cassie Kelly, Kokomo, is a foster sister. Mrs. Jane Huddleston, Mrs. June Westmoreland, Howard Long and three children who died in infancy preceded the brother.

Mr. Long became a member of Judson Baptist church more than 30 years ago and served it actively. For the past 14 years he had been a trustee. His devotion was manifested in giving his service as caretaker of the heating facilities without reimbursement for several years. In many other ways he showed his love by unselfish service.

He also was deeply interested in the local school. Since 1928 he had driven one of the school buses, conveying his own or neighborhood children to the Ervin school. The same unselfish kindness extended to friends and neighbors.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock (1 est) Thursday afternoon at the Judson church with burial to be made in the South Union cemetery.
