

## Ned Booher

Ned Booher, 92, 421 S. Phillips St., died at 5 p.m. Thursday, March 29, 2001, at Northwoods Village. He was born Jan. 30, 1910, in Kokomo, the son of Owen Melvern and Nelle (Peterson) Booher. He was never married.

He was a 1928 graduate of Kokomo High School and a 1933 graduate of Purdue University.

He was in the 104th Division in the Army during World War II.

He worked for the Rotary International in Chicago. He also worked for the Department of Agriculture in Washington, D.C., and he was involved with local trucking firms in Kokomo until he joined the Stellite Division of Union Carbide in 1955. He retired from the sales department of Cabot Corporation in Kokomo in 1972.

He was a member of the Historical Society for 60 years. He belonged to the Sons of Union Veterans Volunteers. He was the author of "Howard County a Pictorial History" and "Kokomo a Pictorial History." He was a member of the Kokomo Stamp Club.

He has been interested in Kokomo history for about 40 years. He had written numerous articles dealing with Kokomo history. He also enjoyed Indiana state history and history of the Civil War. He enjoyed collecting Kokomo post cards as well as books, clippings, and photographs.

He is survived by several great-nieces and great-nephews, and many great friends and neighbors. He was preceded in death by his parents.
