Clarence R. "Ray" Cameron, 75, of Kokomo, died 4:25 p.m. Monday, Jan. 3, 2005, at his residence. He was born Jan. 23, 1929, in Judsonia, Ark., a son of Clarence Sr. and Ellen (Byard) Cameron. He married Joan Wright April 29, 1958, at Parr Methodist Church and she survives.
