William C. DuBois, 58, retired postal worker, died in the Caylor-Nickel Clinic Hospital, Bluffton, at 5:30 a.m. Tuesday following a three-month illness.

His home was at 2307 W. Maple St.

Born April 30, 1914, in Kokomo, he was the son of Lockwood and Grace DuBois. He had lived in this vicinity most of his life.

In 1937 he was married to Lucille Maroney, who survives.

He retired from the Kokomo Post Office June 1, 1972, following 35 years' service, both as a letter carrier and as a clerk. *29 Aug 1972*
