## Copt John P. Fewell Jr. Killed in Action in Viet

A Kokomoan who was a member of the Army's famous' Green Bereis has been killed in action while on patrol in South Viet Nam.

Capt. John P. Fewell Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. John P. Fewell Sr., had been reported missing since Jan. 20. Word of his death was received from the Department of Defense.

Fewell's wife, Joyce, received details of her husband's death from Maj. John H. Trensdale, Capt. Fewell's commanding officer.

The major said Capt. Fewell/ was leading a patrol of American and South Vietnamese that was clearing an area 55 miles southwest of Da Nang. He was stationed at a Special Forces camp at Tra Bong.

During the mission 100 Viet Cong were killed. Maj. Trensdale said Fewell and his South Vietmamese first action.
