

# Capt. John P. Fewell Jr. Killed in Action in Viet

A Kokomoan who was a member of the Army's famous Green Berets has been killed in action while on patrol in South Viet Nam.

Capt. John P. Fewell Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. John P. Fewell Sr., had been reported missing since Jan. 20. Word of his death was received from the Department of Defense.

Fewell's wife, Joyce, received details of her husband's death from Maj. John H. Trensedale, Capt. Fewell's commanding officer.

The major said Capt. Fewell was leading a patrol of American and South Vietnamese that was clearing an area 55 miles southwest of Da Nang. He was stationed at a Special Forces camp at Tra Bong.

During the mission 100 Viet Cong were killed. Maj. Trensedale said Fewell and his South Vietnamese first lieutenant, were killed in the action.

Further details of Fewell's death were not available, according to Trensedale, who conducted several patrols looking for Fewell after he was

reported missing. Capt. Fewell's body was found June 7.

It is now enroute to the United States from Saigon. There is no information on its time of arrival but the body will be taken to the McCloskey, Hamilton, Kahle Funeral Home in Logansport.

Capt. Fewell will be buried with full military honors in services at the Broadway Methodist Church in Logansport. His wife and two-year-old daughter, Jullanna, live in Logansport.

Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Garden Cemetery in Kokomo.

Fewell was a 1957 graduate of Kokomo High School and was a member of the Wildcats football team.
