

# Harold D. Gamrath, retired Kokomo businessman, is dead

Harold D. Gamrath, 79, 2307 W. Jefferson Road, a prominent Kokomo businessman for 38 years, died at 4:20 a.m. Monday in St. Joseph Memorial Hospital.

Born April 12, 1899, in Fort Wayne, he was the son of Charles and Margaret (Miller) Gamrath. He was married Sept. 2, 1925, to Thelma M. Myers, who survives.

He attended Purdue University and moved to Kokomo in 1940. He was president of Rolling Mill Scrap Inc. and Gamrath Industries, retiring in December 1977.

He was a member and former trustee of First Congregational United Church of Christ and a member of Kokomo Rotary Club, Elks Lodge, Kokomo Country Club, Fort Wayne Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite and Shrine. He was a veteran of World War I.
