Bryan D. Glenn, 65, 4210 Ridgewood Road, Jackson, Miss., a Kokomo native, died at 6:30 p.m. Friday,

 Jan. 23, 1998, at University of Mississippi Medical Center. He was born Oct. 19, 1932 in Kokomo, the son of William Jennings and Lois Fields (McKinney) Glenn. He was married in Kokomo June 30, 1956 to Mary Jane Zell who survives.

Glenn was a 1950 graduate of Kokomo High School. He served in the U.S. Marine Corp from 1950 to 1954 spending 13 months in Korea. He then attended Indiana University at Kokomo and earned an associate degree in practical electronics from Purdue University, Indianapolis Campus. He retired as a general supervisor after 37 years with Delco Radio/Electronics, a division of General Motors. He then worked as a self employed building contractor. He was a Boy Scout leader and a Junior Achievement sponsor. He had worked with Habitat for Humanity in Kokomo and in Jackson. In 1993 he went to South Dakota and worked with Jimmy Carter and 1,500 other volunteers of Habitat for Humanity building homes on an Indian Reservation. He served on the board of trustees and property committee of Grace United Methodist Church, Kokomo. He had been a resident of Jackson for almost three years. He was a member of Christ United Methodist Church, the Tuesday and Friday Men's Prayer Groups, and the Christian Home Builders Sunday School Class. He was a member of Whisper Lake Country Club, Masonic Lodge 600, North Jackson Lions Club, the Indianapolis Valley Scottish Rite, and the Murat Shrine Club of Indianapolis. He loved to hunt, fish and attend plays and the symphony.

Also surviving are a daughter and son-in-law, Julia A. and Charles K. Moore, Ridgeland, Miss.; a son, Douglas K. Glenn, Salt Lake City, Utah; four grandchildren, Bryan Moore, Emily Moore, Ashley Glenn and Garrett Glenn; and two sisters, Betty Hegenbart and Pam McKinney, both of Kokomo.

A memorial service will be 6 p.m. Friday at Grace United Methodist Church, 219 W. Mulberry St., with the Rev. Charles Johnson officiating, assisted by the Rev. Mike Butler. The family will receive friends in the church parlor following the memorial service. Burial was in Sunset Memory Gardens Cemetery.
