

C. M. Graff, Retired Druggist Here, Dead

Charles M. Graff, 80, veteran Kokomo druggist and former partner in the Blue Cross Drug Store, died Monday at 11:30 a.m. in St. Joseph Memorial Hospital. He had been seriously ill for the past two months. 3-24-64 p.2

Mr. Graff, whose home was at 2505 S. Webster St., was born June 29, 1883, at Mt. Vernon, O., the son of Smith and Kenzie (Marlin) Graff. He moved to Kokomo in 1914 from Lafayette, and for 43 years was in partnership with his brother Leroy in the Blue Cross store.

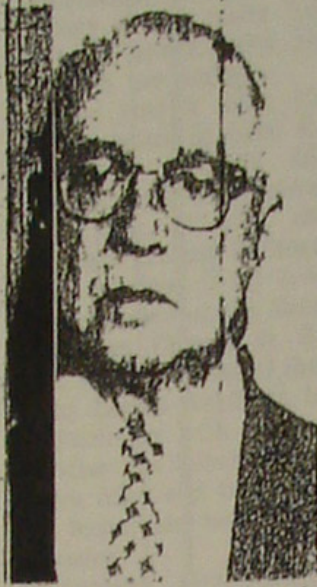
He had started working in a drug store in Anderson in 1904. He and his brother operated a drug store in Lafayette for eight years before they came to Kokomo and acquired the Blue Cross from Fred Leeds.

They sold the Blue Cross in 1937 to William M. Graff, son of Leroy, and Charles retired at that time. Leroy Graff died Feb. 20, 1963.

Mr. Graff was married April 24, 1910, to Otilia Gehring of Lafayette. She survives with two daughters, Miss Margaret A. Graff and Mrs. William (Marion) Tennent Jr., both of Kokomo; and a brother, Arthur L. Graff, Dracut, Mass.

The body is at the Fenn Funeral Home where friends may call after 4 p.m. Tuesday. Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Fenn Chapel, with the Rev. S. Lawrence Johnson, pastor of the First Congregational Christian Church, officiating.

Burial will be in Sunset Memory Gardens Cemetery.
