NAPLES, Fla. -- Marian Bentley Malone, 87, passed away Tuesday, Nov. 2, 2004, due to ravages of time and cancer. She grew up and lived in Kokomo for 75 of her 87 years before moving with husband Bill to the Naples, Fla. area in 1987.

She was a member of P.E.O. National Sorority for 57 years and president seven times. She graduated from DePauw University, class of 1939 and was also a graduate of John Herron Art Institute in Milwaukee, Wis.

An accomplished artist and musician, she touched and taught hundreds the beauty, history, design, construction and creation of some of the greatest stained glass windows and pieces ever created. Her work was shown in museums and galleries in the U.S. and Europe, including the Louvre Museum in Paris. Her work was featured on the cover of Time Magazine.

Brilliant but wise, nurturing but resolute, soft but expectant, loving and caring; she embodied all the good the human endeavor can bring to their time on our earth.
