Marjorie S. Underwood, 97, Mooresville, a former Kokomo resident, died 8:45 a.m. Sunday, June 15, 2008, at Meadow Lakes in Mooresville. She was born Aug. 12, 1910, in Brazil, the daughter of William I. and Louisa (Jackson) Scott. On Feb. 24, 1940, in Kokomo, she married Glenn W. Underwood, and he preceded her in death on Dec. 24, 1970.

Marjorie was a 1928 graduate of Brazil High School and a 1931 graduate of Indiana Central University (now the University of Indianapolis). She received her master's of art degree from Butler University. She was dean of girls for 20 years at Northwestern School Corp, having retired in 1976. She previously taught at Salisbury, from 1931 to 1938; Howard Township, Kokomo from 1938-1948; Center Township, Kokomo from 1952 to 1958; and Clay-Miami Schools from 1952 to 1958. Marjorie had a love of counseling girls and of the Latin language.

She was a member of St. Luke's United Methodist Church, Indiana Teachers Association, Sigma Eta Sorority, Friendship Home, where she had been on the board of directors, American Association of University Women and Indiana Junior Classical League. She was also a Sunday school teacher.

She is survived by her son, Richard G. Underwood; grandson, Andrew S. Underwood; stepgrandchildren, J. Keith Hiatt and Kristy Storm; sister, Alta Green; and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband; three brothers, Hubert, Harold and Mark Scott; and sister, Geraldine Starbuck.

Funeral services are 11 a.m. Thursday at St. Luke's United Methodist Church, 700 E. Southway Blvd., with the Revs. Mike Dominick and Harold Williams officiating.
