Enemy Grenade Causes Death Of Kokomoan

Howard County's list of Vietnam war dead grew longer this week with the word of the death of Pfc. Bruce A. Yoder, 19, U.S. Marine Corps, July 2 in the Southeast Asian country.

Pfc. Yoder, son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard O. Arnold, 1841 W. Judson Rd., died of grenade wounds from enemy action while he was on patrol in Quang-Tri. He had been in Vietnam six weeks.

He is the third Marine from Howard County — and the county's seventh serviceman — killed in the war. *6 July 1967 p. 1*

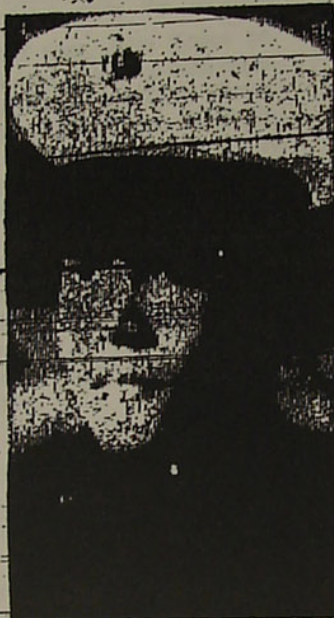
The others were:

Marine Corporals Douglas Arthur Clester of Kokomo, killed June 12, 1966 and Tommie Max Cripe of Russiaville killed April 16, 1966.

Army Capt. John Phillip Fewell of Kokomo, killed Jan. 28, 1966; Air Force Capt. William Keith Cogdell of Greentown, killed Jan. 17, 1967; S. Sgt. Jerry Louis Spicer of Kokomo, killed Feb. 3, 1967; and A2-C Gary L. Fuller, killed Feb. 27, 1967.

Pfc. Yoder was born Dec. 4, 1947 in Kokomo. He attended Kokomo High School and the First Presbyterian Church. He was a member of the Youth Canteen.

He enlisted in the Marines on Sept. 28, 1966 and had military training at Camp Pendleton, Calif.
